

## David Labkovski Project

Artist and Holocaust survivor David Labkovski documented Holocaust history through art to bear witness to the events of his lifetime. His exhibit, "Documenting History Through Art" will be on display at the East Valley JCC for its Arizona premiere. Leora Raikin, executive director of the project, will speak at an opening reception on Nov. 8 and a VIP reception on Nov. 11. The exhibit is available for private receptions and group tours. There will also be workshops and lectures.

The East Valley JCC partners with Scottsdale Community College to present this exhibition, which was curated by historian and film director Christian Delage and designed, created and distributed by the Memorial de la Shoah in Paris and made possible through the support of SNCF. The exhibit explores these filmmakers' experiences during and after World War II, their confrontation with Nazi atrocities and the mark that it left on them as artists. An opening reception will be held on Feb. 19. There will also be workshops, a film screening and lectures.

## Jonatas Chimen: A Crypto Jew's Journey and Art

Jonatas Chimen, a Brazilian-American Symbolist artist, author and academic, explores his personal and collective identity in his work, which includes "Journey: A Visual Narrative," an art collection about his family's crypto-Jewish heritage, and "In Thy Tent I Dwell," a multi-sensory installation that retells the stories of immigration, adaptation forced conversions and hybridization of the artist's family. The program includes tours, an art auction and lectures.
